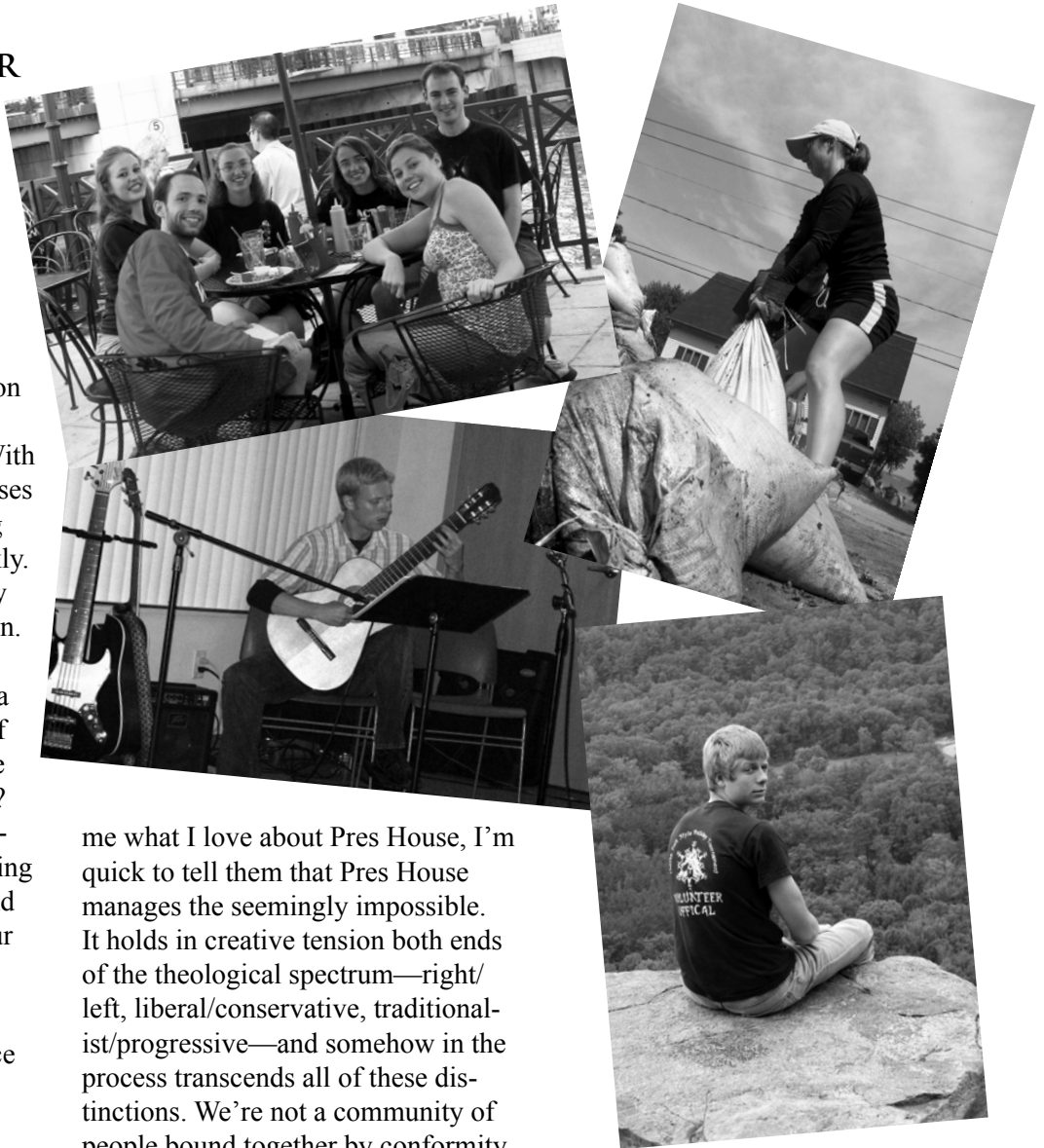
A STUDENT PERSPECTIVE: SUMMER AT PRES HOUSE

UW campus (Rom. 15:7). As our conversation widens and deepens, I feel sure that God's grace will become ever clearer and, correspondingly, ever more brilliant.

Jesus served the world by addressing people's deepest needs. We, too, have been serving people this summer, meeting them at the place where a witness to hope is most needed. As many of you know, the Midwest endured devastating floods earlier this summer. A group from Pres House was able to help in the relief efforts near Busseyville, a small community just southeast of us in Jefferson County. Along with residents and other workers, we spent the better part of a day removing sandbags from previously flooded areas. It was satisfying if hard work.

Such opportunities are constant reminders that communities like ours don't exist for themselves. Christianity is a lifestyle, not a club. Are we prepared to be radical disciples of Jesus? CHURCHES SUPPORT TWO NEW PROGRAMS FOR 2008-09!

PRES HOUSE LIFE TOGETHER

Four students and our chaplain intern will be growing and serving together this year in a new and experimental program for the purpose of:

- Growing individually through intentional reflection, goal setting, and mentoring from pastoral staff.
- Developing trust and community together by experiencing and practicing hospitality. The program members all live in the Pres House Residence and will share regular meals, prayer, and worship together.
- Helping other students in the larger Residence and Worship community experience God's welcome and love by providing hospitality, serving as leaders, and modeling Christian community.

Funding for the program comes from Christ Presbyterian Church. Members of Christ Church are giving up to \$100,000 that will be matched by \$50,000 from the church endowment. Over half of that amount has already been given.

PISTOIS: FAITHFUL IN MIND AND DEED..."

Pres House will have the vision of "Pistois: Faithful in mind and deed..." during the 2008-09 academic year. Pistois means "faithful" in Greek. The Pistois program strives to create a generation of students who are faithful to God by engaging in the world around them. This year-long program encourages students to live out Christ's calling to serve others by focusing on four core areas:

1. Growing in theological understanding of service through sermons, Bible studies, and discussion groups.
2. Growing in local and global awareness through field trips,

video screenings, and guest speakers.

3. Increasing student involvement in service opportunities. We hope to have students engage in 460 total service hours during the 2008-09 academic year.
4. Equipping student leaders to develop student-led initiatives that fall in the first three core areas.

The Pistois program is supported through a \$5,000 grant from the John N. Bergstrom Endowment Fund of First Presbyterian Church, Neenah, WI.

Pres House thanks all of our supporting churches for their generous funding that makes ministry at UW-Madison possible. ☩
